




Test the Waters

From the Kalamazoo River to the harbor and Lake Michigan, there are so many ways to experience the water in the Saugatuck/Douglas area. Here are our top picks for the most interesting ways to explore our unsalted wayes. Experience the scenic Kalamazoo River and the expansive, fresh waters of breathtaking Lake Michigan on **Schooner Serenity**, Saugatuck's only authentic Tall Ship. Or consider taking a ride on the **Star of Saugatuck**, a 51-ton double-decker paddlewheel boat which traverses the Kalamazoo River into Lake Michigan, giving you a leisurely view of the town, harbor, and scenic natural areas.

For those looking for a more active way to take in the water, consider a **HydroBike** adventure down the Kalamazoo River through the picturesque and peaceful Allegan Forest where you can encounter bald eagles and river otters. Families or groups may want to consider renting a **Donut Boat**, a fun and dog-friendly way to explore the harbor on your own. Or take the party to the water with a **West Michigan Cycleboat** where groups of up to 12 people provide pedal power and enjoy beverages while a staff member steers them along the Kalamazoo River. Finally, embrace a bygone era by renting a classic runabout **Retro Boat** from the late 50s and early 60s for a more nostalgic method of exploring Saugatuck's waterways.

SAUGATUCK IN THE SUMMER is a place where music is always in the air, and people are ready to have a good time. That's exactly what Holley offers with his signature "funky pop" style of music. From 90s hip hop to Top 40 hits, he puts his own twist on songs that get people dancing. And don't let his oneguy-and-his guitar act fool you. Playing over a self-engineered loop of prerecorded sound, Holley's music is rich, surprising, and always a ton of fun.

What do you like about the local music scene?

Saugatuck is an amazing town. It reminds me of Florida, where I used to live. When you walk down the street, there's music outside and in every bar. And in Saugatuck, it feels like listeners and artists come in with open minds. Everyone wants to make the night bigger, and the energy amplifies. This magic happens all over town. You find that good music is promoting more good music.

Are you excited about any local musicians?

I always like the people who think about it a little bit deeper than just showing up and playing four chords. I don't know if you've ever heard of the Cheap Dates. It's two guys, Simon and Eric. And it's similar to what I do because Eric, the drummer, creates tracks off of popular songs. They don't take up too much space, but their sound is huge. Their song list is amazing. People should also check out Trixie Tang and Rock Shop. They always have great crowds. Then there's Delilah DeWylde. She plays a stand-up bass, and she's really unique. Also, I just saw a guy for the first time, Michael Hulett, who plays the saxophone. He's a world class talent. For a town so small, you wouldn't expect so much variety. But we certainly have it.

What are some of your favorite places to play?

I play at **Wally's**, which is really fun. It reminds me a lot of the places I've played in Chicago and Florida. Wally's gets really busy, so the energy is great. **The Butler Deck** and the deck at **Coral Gables** always seem to be on fire. People are out partying and having a good time. And then every once in a while, the **Saugatuck Center for the Arts** brings in a big show that you can't miss.

What recommendations would you make to someone visiting the area?

Follow your ears. Because on a nice summer day, when you're walking down the street, your ears will tell you where you want to go. You'll hear a classic rock band over at the **Butler Deck**. You'll hear an 80s band at **Wicks Park**. And then you'll hear me playing 90s hip hop songs at **Wally's**. My favorite part is that you don't have to commit. Almost all of those places are outdoors, so you can just walk around the town and listen to the music until you find a spot where you want to stay.



Face the Music

Music in the Park

This concert series happens every other Tuesday at 7 pm throughout the summer in downtown Fennville's **Memorial Park** and features a variety of musical genres.

Live Music on the Lawn

Thursdays at the Felt

This annual summer concert series takes place every Thursday at 7 pm at the **Felt Estate**. Admission is free with food and beverages available for purchase beginning at 6 pm.

Four Days of Summer


With so much to do in the area, we want you to savor every moment of your getaway.

Day 1

Head off on a gallery stroll to discover why we're called the art coast of Michigan. Make sure to stop by Amazwi, Cynthia McKean Sculpture Gardens, and Roan & Black. To explore even more galleries, pop over to Douglas and Fennville and check out J. Petter Galleries, Peachbelt Studio, Khenmu Studio, and Water Street Gallery. If it's Friday night, check out the Ox-Bow School of Art when faculty and students open their studios, offer demonstrations, and auction off their work.

Day 2

Jump on an open-roof **Saugatuck Dune Ride** for an exhilarating and fun-filled
tour over Lake Michigan's "living" sand
dunes. Once you've hit the dunes, it's
time to see the area from the water
with a **Star of Saugatuck** paddlewheel
boat cruise along the Kalamazoo River.
See what it means to be in Michigan's
"fruit belt" by checking out our farmers
market and local farm stands. Spend
the evening at one of **Fenn Valley's**Summer Evening Cook-Outs relaxing in
the vineyards enjoying Michigan wine,
food, and music.



Day 3

Pack a picnic lunch and spend the day exploring the Saugatuck Harbor Natural Area or Saugatuck Dunes State Park for a hike overlooking the dunes. Head back into town, grab a drink on the Butler Deck for spectacular waterfront views and live music every weekend in the summer. After dinner at one of our many phenomenal restaurants, take in a summer performance at the Saugatuck Center for the Arts.

Day 4

Discover the Saugatuck-Douglas
Museum located in the historic
Saugatuck Pump House. Explore
an exhibit and then visit its garden
before climbing the 302 steps up to
Mount Baldhead to take in a stunning
panoramic view of the area and Lake
Michigan. Descend onto the grassy
coastal sands and hike the one-mile
loop back. Shop for keepsakes to
treasure among our many boutiques,
and then end the evening with an
unforgettable sunset cruise on the
Schooner Serenity.

Beer School

Kitchen & Gardening Workshops

Pennyroyal Café and Provisions offers classes including kitchen and ornamental garden design, permaculture, seed savings, herb use and application, butchery, butter and cheese making, preservation, foraging, and weekly meal planning.

Art on the Meadow

Each summer, the **Ox-Bow School of Art** and Artists' Residency offers a

Watercolor, Pastels, Letterpress Printing,
Photography, Writing, Cooking, and
Beer Brewing.

Sailing Lessons

Blast From the Past

Our glorious past offers nostalgic experiences that are still enjoyed by generations of visitors.



Excursion boats have been a longtime fixture of summertime fun in the area. Originally launched in 1978, this quintessential Saugatuck water experience now offers paddlewheel boat tours along the Kalamazoo River on the **Star of Saugatuck**, a 51-ton authentic sternwheeler.

Climb aboard the Diane, the only remaining hand-cranked **Chain Ferry** of its kind in the United States. Part of the unique character of our town since 1857, today's boat has been crossing the Kalamazoo River since 1965.

Relive the kitsch and character of the novelty sites of the 1950s with a visit to Douglas's 17-foot tall **Root Beer Barrel**, a beloved hangout of beachgoers. This concession stand has been newly restored and is right on the way to Oval Beach.

The historic **Saugatuck Pump House** now serves as the Saugatuck-Douglas History Museum. Built initially as Saugatuck's first water pumping station in 1904, the building is now home to one of Michigan's best-known and most-visited small-town museums.

Beginning in the 1950s, open-roof dune rides have taken visitors off the road and deep into the rolling hills of sand overlooking Lake Michigan. The vehicles themselves may have changed since then, but **Saugatuck Dune Rides** still offer the thrill of those bygone days.

Completed in 1928, the **Felt Estate** recalls a lavish history with tours featuring the mansion's 25 rooms and extravagant ballroom, a carriage house, historic chapel, and expansive grounds, which include the Shore Acres Farm buildings.

Give in to your sweet tooth with these tasty local treats.

Cool off with a soft-serve cone from Blue Star Café & Ice Cream Treats or a hand-dipped cone from Charlie's 'Round the Corner Ice Cream. Or beat the heat with a self-serve frozen treat from Nottie's Frozen Yogurt or a dairy-free Summer Joy Smoothie from Boardwalk Deli & Ice Cream. For to-die-for handmade chocolates and Mackinac Island-style fudge, look no further than Kilwins in downtown Saugatuck. For the very best bakery muffins to indulge in with your morning coffee, try Uncommon Coffee Roasters.

And no visit to the area is complete without a stop at Crane's Pie Pantry Restaurant. Specializing in Michigan fruit pies and desserts, Crane's bakery also features cinnamon rolls, cookies, and apple cider donuts that are impossible to resist.





Yoga



Why choose just one thing when you can try it all?

The best way to sample all the goodness available at Crane's Pie Pantry Restaurant & Winery is to try one (or more) of their flights. Select tastings of four different wines or hard ciders and then indulge in a Pie Flight featuring four of their delectable pies made with only the best fruit from Michigan. Pizza lovers should head over to the Mitten Brewing Company and try out their Pizza Flight, which includes slices of any six of their 12 specialty pizzas. Craft beer fans need to make a stop at Guardian Brewing Company, Saugatuck Brewing Company, and Waypost Brewing Co., which offer flights featuring their fresh craft beers. And, for something a little harder, visit the Coppercraft Distillery Tasting Room or the New Holland Brewing Tasting Room, where you can sample a flight of their exceptional, handcrafted spirits.

In Good Taste

The next time you experience the peppery bite of arugula or the explosion of flavor from a quality jar of pesto, you may want to send Julee Rosso a thank-you. Or better yet, do it in person at the **Wickwood Inn**, a B&B she's owned with her husband for the last 28 years.

To say that America's approach to food has been irrevocably influenced by Julee is nothing short of an understatement. Challenged with hosting spontaneous dinner parties during an era when gourmet take-out simply didn't exist, she and her business partner, Sheila Lukins, opened the Silver Palate food shop in New York's Upper West Side in 1977. Introducing dishes and ingredients bursting with flavor, this venture eventually led to a line of nationally distributed specialty foods and the publication of *The Silver Palate Cookbook*. With millions of copies sold and a firm place in the James Beard Cookbook Hall of Fame, the book is still as relevant today as when it was originally published in 1982.

Has your approach to cooking changed much since you wrote your first cookbook?

Maybe some of the techniques but not my overall approach. I grew up in Kalamazoo with tuna noodle casserole and steak and pie for dinner. Even fine cooking back then was more nuanced. One of the signatures of the Silver Palate was this idea of magnified flavors. There was nothing subtle about our cooking. Even now, I like flavors that knock your socks off and make you sit up and take notice.

What do you hope that people come away with after staying at the Wickwood Inn?

With my background, of course, it's all about the food. We offer a giant Farm-to-Table Breakfast, 3–4 different freshly baked cookies in the afternoon, and then Sips & Small Plates in the evening. I absolutely love exposing people to new foods. Everyone understands good food once they taste it. It's like meeting people who are different from yourself. Maybe you're afraid at first, but once you realize it's good, it changes everything.

What would you tell someone planning a trip to the area who's a foodie?

Wherever I travel, I always go to the farmer's markets. To meet the local people and see what they're selling really gives you a sense for the soul of the community. So, stop by our local Farmer's Market. In the fall, visit **Virtue Cider** and go to **Crane's** for pie, donuts, and apple-picking. And be sure to visit **Evergreen Lane Farms**—they're doing a great job with artisanal goat cheeses.

There are just so many wonderful places to eat around here, and our guests love the spectrum of choices. I'm addicted to the Whitefish Melt at Pennyroyal Café & Provisions, and The Southerner's Fried Chicken and Biscuits is a must-try. Ida Red's is one of the best kept local secrets. Another is the Guardian Brewery. While the beer is certainly terrific—we go there for the food.

We're just surrounded by agricultural abundance and have such diversity in the things we grow in Michigan. I appreciate that there's a big commitment here now to cooking what's at arm's length.

Matt Millar



Consider the Source

For two-time James Beard Award semi-finalist, Matt Millar, there was a clear moment during the grad school application process when he realized his true calling was not in academia. Working in restaurants to make ends meet like so many other college students, Matt soon realized that he much preferred working in a kitchen over comparative studies of English and Russian literature.

The Southerner, his latest culinary venture with co-owners Katie and Jonathon Fris, is a heartfelt homage to Appalachian cooking. And while the menu items feature down-home Southern fare, Matt considers what he's learned from his fine-dining executive chef experiences to hold true—that better tasting food is directly connected to better sourcing of raw ingredients. This is why Matt remains committed to using only seasonal local produce, meats, and dairy from nearby Michigan farms in his dishes.

What do you hope that people come away with after dining at The Southerner?

Southern hospitality actually exists. It's a real thing. Tourist destinations can be so busy and overwhelming, so we wanted to provide a true sense of hospitality for our guests—an environment that's genuinely happy from the inside out. I want our guests to feel like they're getting a big hug.

What's unique about the food scene in Saugatuck/Douglas?

We're just surrounded by agricultural abundance and have such diversity in the things we grow in Michigan. I appreciate that there's a big commitment here now to cooking what's at arm's length. By eating what's grown in our fields, it puts people more in touch with the agricultural world. All the farm stands we have here and all the events—it's just a great place to enjoy food.

What would you tell someone planning a trip to the area who's a foodie?

Fall is absolutely the best time to be here, especially for food. In September, the beaches aren't crowded, but it's still warm. And it's harvest time. People forget that fall is when everything is at its peak and becomes available locally at our markets.

I really like **Waypost Brewing**. They don't serve food, but I think they make the best beer. **Salt of the Earth** has great live music, cocktails, and woodfired pizzas. And the **Farmhouse Deli & Pantry** always has amazing food with a lot of healthy options.

A Cut Above

In a field that's been historically dominated by men, Missy Corey has proven herself as a force to be reckoned with. Whether it's mastering the art of butchering or cooking her way to victory on the reality show, Chopped, Missy thrives on challenges. That and the adrenaline rush combined with artistry that comes from working in the restaurant industry.

A Chicago native who has also honed her culinary skills in Portland, Maine, Missy now calls the Saugatuck/Douglas area home. She recently teamed up with pastry chef Bryan Kemp and farmer and garden designer Ryan Beck to open Pennyroyal Café & Provisions featuring farm-to-table cuisine.

Of all the places to start a restaurant, why did you choose this specific area?

Ryan and I saw the agricultural potential of what you can grow here. There's so much agricultural diversity here, but there had been less emphasis on organic farming and permaculture farming. And, so we wanted to help shape that.

We also loved how sophisticated the area is considering how rural it is. There's this amazing art scene here. I had grown up taking classes at the Art Institute of Chicago, so having Ox-Bow here and the Saugatuck Center of the Arts is just great. We love the lakeshore and the dunes. We've come to love winter hiking, cross country skiing, and all the seasonal changes you experience here. There's this solitude of winter and then the swing of summer, which I just love.

What do you hope that people come away with after dining at Pennyroyal?

It's all about the freshness of the food. We purchase things within 50 miles of the restaurant and get deliveries every day. We have a small menu that highlights only what's at the peak of seasonality. People really notice the vibrancy and the difference in taste when you eat something just picked. It just tastes fresher and more alive.

What would you tell someone planning a trip to the area who's a foodie?

September or October is the best time. It's cider season and apple season. That's when the crush happens, and Fenn Valley has their Beaujolais. We really love going to Borrowed Time and Bowdie's Chophouse, just to name a few. There are so many great places that have been here a long time—we feel really lucky to be part of the culinary scene here.

People really notice the vibrancy and the difference in taste when you eat something just picked. It just tastes fresher and more alive.

by the moon. Whimsical sculptures in a palette reminiscent of garden flowers. Everything about artist Jeff Blandford is a little unexpected. Pry into his influences, and he lists mid-century modern furniture design, science, and his garden. Ask him about the places he's displayed his pottery, glass, and metal work, and he'll tell you about the time he created wine decanters and cannonballs for the "A Modernist in the Colony" exhibit at George Washington's war-time quarters, the historic Morris-Jumel Mansion in Manhattan. You can see the results of his experimental approach at his gallery in downtown Saugatuck—one of many studios and galleries worth exploring in the area.

What's great about owning a gallery in Saugatuck?

For being such a small town, people are so aware of the arts. But it's approachable. I have people come in who've never visited a gallery before. They find themselves asking a lot of questions and learning. I want people to appreciate the design and function in my work, but to see the whimsy too. I often say that if Charles and Ray Eames and Dr. Seuss had a baby it would be me. Maybe with some elements of Tim Burton.

What's unique about the local arts community?

There's something for everyone. You can stroll around the galleries, go to great restaurants, or see a show at the **Saugatuck Center for the Arts**. On Friday nights in the summer, artists at **Ox-Bow School of the Arts** open their studios for demonstrations and displays of their work. And for me, as an artist, there's something special about walking down the street, seeing other artists that I know, and feeling like I'm part of a bigger community.

Which local artists and events should people check out?

I recommend stopping by **Peachbelt Studio**, an artist-owned gallery in a historic schoolhouse in Fennville. Dawn Stafford's oil paintings are fabulous. A great glassblower and metalworker is Jessica Bohus. She was in the top 10 during ArtPrize in Grand Rapids a few years ago. There are also events like the **Blue Coast Artists' Tour** in the fall. Artists turn their studios into places people can visit and buy art over a weekend.

IF YOU'RE STARTING TO GET CABIN FEVER as winter winds down, there's no better way to gear up for spring than by attending the Real to Reel Festival, featuring films from "Mountainfilm on Tour" in Saugatuck. It's the only place in Michigan—and one of a handful of select cities across the country—where you can see documentaries from an event touted as one of the "25 Film Festivals in the World" by MovieMaker magazine. Through documentary film, this unique, community-wide event aims to inspire audiences to create a better world. And while you're getting inspired, you'll also get a taste of the outdoor adventure you may have been missing during the colder months.

The Real to Reel Festival is your opportunity to see award-winning documentaries that debuted at the Mountainfilm Festival in Telluride, CO. Organized by the **Saugatuck Center for Arts** (SCA), this festival is just one example of many cultural events the SCA brings to the community.

And if you are in Saugatuck for Real to Reel, the feeling you get is a lot like the town-takeover that happens in Telluride during the Mountainfilm festival. This includes art exhibitions, a feature film debut, and an after-party. Saturday is an entire day of film at unique venues. And to complement the films, which often focus on environmental issues or feats of outdoor athleticism, the SCA organizes events such as a hike up Mount Baldhead, a steep dune with breathtaking views of Lake Michigan.

"We invite people to stop by after the festival for complimentary appetizers," says Mindy Trafman, Chef at **Coast 236**, a restaurant specializing in fresh seafood and local fare. "What I love about March is that it feels like you're having VIP experience in town," says Armstrong. "You get all the charm of Saugatuck and Douglas without fighting the summertime crowds. And you get to see some very authentic, inspiring films."
